## I. Enjoying the Outdoors

The Twin Cities boast an active, outdoor community. Parks and trails for hiking, bike rentals for driving the numerous bike paths, and lakes, rivers, and streams for all your water needs.

#### The Walker Sculpture Garden

 Located by the Walker Art Center, this free venue features several artistic sculptures and displays.



Minneapolis Lakes

 13 lakes call Minneapolis home. The largest and most notable ones include Bde Maka Ska, Lake Harriet, Lake Nokomis, Cedar Lake, Lake of the Isles, and Lake Hiawatha.



Minnehaha Falls

 These beautiful falls, located in the Minnehaha Regional Park, can be found right in the heart of the Twin Cities.



## Stone Arch Bridge

The Stone Arch Bridge is just one of many sites running along the Mississippi River. This particular location sports a beautiful historic bridge connecting Downtown Minneapolis with the scenic St. Anthony Main. At the latter location one can find cafes, bars, a movie theater, and a couple forested trails.



## II. Arts and Culture

## Minneapolis Institute of Art

 This free museum displays a vast range of art and antiquities from throughout the world and time.
